

Selectmen's Meeting Minutes
Tuesday, July 7, 2015

Present: Chairman Bowles and Selectman Krieger.

Chairman Bowles called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

- I. Chairman Bowles moved to approve the Selectmen's Meeting Minutes of Tuesday, June 30, 2015 as written. Seconded by Selectman Krieger. All in favor. Motion carried.

- II. The Board began their review of weekly correspondence.
 - a. The Board received a letter of resignation from Transfer Station Manager Steve Bennett effective August 29, 2015. In his letter Mr. Bennett thanked the residents and other town employees of Loudon for making his 12 years an enjoyable experience.
 - b. The Board received the Chichester ambulance subsidy bill for their review. The Board agreed that the bill will be forwarded to Chichester.
 - c. The Board received a notice from Road Agent Houle regarding paving. Construction/paving will begin July 13, 2015 on the following roads: Lovejoy, Stonegate Terrace and Piper Hill, road closures and delays should be expected.
 - d. The Board received a Wetlands Application for New England Flower Farms for a project on Route 106.
 - e. The Board received the Agricultural Commission Minutes of June 4, 2015.
 - f. The Board received a McNeil/Cummings Scholarship thank you from recipient Warren Bartlett.
 - g. The Board received a memo from the Office Manager regarding 75 Mudgett Hill Road.
 - h. The Board received a memo from the Office Manager regarding 73 Ricker Road.
 - i. The Board received miscellaneous correspondence.

- III. The received the following reminders:
 - a. Thursday, July 9, 2015 at 1:15 pm is a TCP Meeting.
 - b. Monday, July 13, 2015 at 7:15 pm is a school board meeting.

- IV. The Board recognized Joseph S. Haas Jr. from the audience. Mr. Haas explained that his biggest complaint is that the Police Chief won't get back to him by email, mail or phone. He said he has no issue with Sean other than the fact that he didn't serve the paperwork to Valerie at the bank. Mr. Haas said that since the Board appointed Chief Fiske maybe they can do something. Selectman Krieger explained that Chief Fiske was appointed by the Selectmen many years ago. He asked Mr. Haas what happened to get him to this point. Mr. Haas explained his history with silver dollars at TD Bank in Dover, Citizens Bank, the Federal Reserve Bank and TD Bank in Concord, the North State Street branch. He said Scott at TD Bank got so angry that he issued a no trespass order. Mr. Haas said he went into the Loudon branch to cash three payroll

checks; a total of \$600.00. He explained that he asked for a box of quarters which is \$500.00 and the others separate; he spoke about asking the bank to order coins. Mr. Haas said the bank told him they would be charging him \$7.00 for cashing his check because he doesn't have an account, he told them they couldn't do that because it is illegal. He said he did pay it in protest with nickels. Mr. Haas said they printed out a no trespass notice and called the cops. He said Sean showed up; he asked Sean to serve the bank. Sean said no and asked him to leave. The bank cancelled his transaction and gave him back a \$5.00 bill and 2 one's but he said he wanted his nickels. He said he ended up taking 3 rolls of nickels and a dollar bill. Mr. Haas said he asked the police department for the paperwork back so he could pay the Sheriff's department \$25.00 to serve it. He explained that he would like to give the police one last opportunity to serve the paperwork. Mr. Haas said he wants to make this a case because it is illegal what the bank is doing. Selectman Krieger asked that Mr. Haas give them time to talk to the Chief. Mr. Haas said he has contacted the Department of Labor, the Banking Commission and the Attorney General. Mr. Haas said he is still waiting to hear from Chief Fiske. Mr. Haas spoke about paperwork regarding Valerie and TD Bank. He spoke about not being able to cash his check because he doesn't have a bank account, all the banks are corrupt. Selectman Krieger asked why he doesn't ask his employer for cash; Mr. Haas said he asked her about direct deposit. He said his employee did add \$7.00 to his check so if he needs to pay to cash it the fee is there. Selectman Krieger said there are two sides to every story so they need to talk to Chief Fiske

- V. The Board recognized Ken Roketenetz and Linda Nelson representatives of Presidential Pines Cooperative from the audience. Mr. Roketenetz explained that they are having a hard time getting prices for removing mobile homes. They are at a standstill because they have some legal issues to resolve with the two mobile homes they are trying to remove. Mr. Roketenetz asked that the town move forward with removing the two homes they own because they have people that would like to move new homes into the park. Chairman Bowles thanked them for the update and said they will move forward as soon as possible.
- VI. Selectman Krieger moved to adjourn at 6:53 PM. Seconded by Chairman Bowles. All in favor. Motion carried.
