

Loudon Recreation Meeting Minutes for October 27, 2010

Review of Revolving Fund Budget and the submission for the 2011 budget. Last year, Alicia Grimaldi discussed with the Selectman creating a warrant article for the tennis courts. Alicia Grimaldi contacted VT Tennis Courts and they will come out on 10/28 to provide an estimate.

The Loudon Recreation Committee and the Agricultural Committees of Loudon will host a Community Supper featuring local farms for the community of Loudon. Melissa Minery of the Loudon Recreation Committee and Earl Tucson of the Agricultural Committee are coordinating the event. The event will be held on Sunday, November 7th at the LES cafeteria from 5:30-7pm.

Farm Feast details were discussed extensively. There are almost 100 registrants and it was thought to double food enough to serve everyone. Jen Pfeifer will check with the LES Food Service Coordinator to check on use of trays, pots, and trays. Alicia Grimaldi will speak with John Cronin of the Egg Shell re. borrowing bowls and spoons. The Egg Shell will also provide bread. Alice Tucson to check with farmers, so we can get a jump start on prepare chicken and squashes. Alice Tucson has

already prepped onions and Jen Pfeifer prepped tomatoes. A list of additional ingredients was compiled. Alicia Grimaldi to contact the Red Blazer to inquire as to a vendor to supply recycled paper goods. Melissa Minery provided a list of participating farmers and all they will be providing. Melissa Minery and Earl Tucson will pick up produce and meat for the event. Set up in the LES cafeterias will take place at 9am on Sunday a.m. Prep of food will take place the evening before and throughout the week prior to the event. Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts to assist with clearing tables, serving and breakdown. Melissa Minery has created a slide show. Alicia Grimaldi will research additional handouts to provide attendees re. eating local. Deb Kardeski printing Ledger Article poster size of all local farms. Flowers for tables will be raffled off. Melissa Minery created a feedback form. Sheryl Claire wrote an article about the event and Alicia Grimaldi will submit to the Ledger.

The Menu will be soups, stews and desserts. The cost \$5 pp. The menu will include chicken stew, squash soup, vegetable soup, and beef stew. Dessert will be pumpkin custard and baked apples. Beverages will include cider and water.
